TRINITY'S MISSIONS MOMENTS

**An Update from
Calvin & Susan Jett
West Africa**

Dear Friends and Prayer Partners,

Recently I returned from visiting Gmb, a new country for us in West Africa. Six of us went to help set up the Biblical training program for the pastors in that country. We also went so that we could prepare for a team which will arrive in mid-February. We had a wonderful visit with Abou and 25 pastors from the Presbyterian Church of Gmb. I preached twice and also got to do an introductory lesson preaching for all the leaders.

I have two distinct memories from the trip. One was distributing some children's Bibles. A few minutes later the 8-10 year olds were dancing and singing in the courtyard with huge smiles on their faces and were singing "I have a Bible." We talk about treasuring the Bible but these West African girls put us to shame with their pure joy in having their own copy of God's Word.

The second memory is of meeting a man named Matthew (not his real name). On the way to pastors' training class we stopped to pick him up. He is a believer from the Wolof tribe. That tribe is largely unreached. The Wolof tribe is large and scattered through out all of West Africa and in all the nation of Gmb there are only 5 believers from his tribe. When he became a Christian his wife's family removed her and their daughter from the home. Later they remarried her to an acceptable man from the predominate religion. The brother has suffered but he has remained strong in the faith. Keep him in your prayers.

In a month I will return to Gmb with a team from a church in South Carolina. Pray for the team as they meet the leaders in the Gmb church. Pray for Pastor Tom as he preaches and for Don, one of the elders, who will teach a course on the doctrine of Christ. Pray for the Lord to expand our understanding of the ministry in Gmb and how we can serve them.

Susan and I thank God for your prayers and gracious gifts that keep us serving the growing church in Animistic and Muslim West Africa.

**SCRIPTURE
 II KINGS 5**

¹ Now Newman, commander of the army of the king of Syria, was a great and honorable man in the eyes of his master, because by him the LORD had given victory to Syria. He was also a mighty man of valor, *but* a leper. ² And the Syrians had gone out on raids, and had brought back captive a young girl from the land of Israel. She waited on Naaman's wife. ³ Then she said to her mistress, "If only my master *were* with the prophet who *is* in Samaria! For he would heal him of his leprosy." ⁴ And *Naaman* went in and told his master, saying, "Thus and thus said the girl who *is* from the land of Israel." ⁵ Then the king of Syria said, "Go now, and I will send a letter to the king of Israel." So he departed and took with him ten talents of silver, six thousand *shekels* of gold, and ten changes of clothing. ⁶ Then he brought the letter to the king of Israel, which said, Now be advised, when this letter comes to you, that I have sent Naaman my servant to you, that you may heal him of his leprosy. ⁷ And it happened, when the king of Israel read the letter, that he tore his clothes and said, "*Am* I God, to kill and make alive, that this man sends a man to me to heal him of his leprosy? Therefore please consider, and see how he seeks a quarrel with me." ⁸ So it was, when Elisha the man of God heard that the king of Israel had torn his clothes, that he sent to the king, saying, "Why have you torn your clothes? Please let him come to me, and he shall know that there is a prophet in Israel." ⁹ Then Naaman went with his horses and chariot, and he stood at the door of Elisha's house. ¹⁰ And Elisha sent a messenger to him, saying, "Go and wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored to you, and *you shall be clean*." ¹¹ But Naaman became furious, and went away and said, "Indeed, I said to myself, 'He will surely come out *to me*, and stand and call on the name of the LORD his God, and wave his hand over the place, and heal the leprosy.' ¹² *Are* not the Abanah and the Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Could I not wash in them and be clean?" So he turned and went away in a rage. ¹³ And his servants came near and spoke to him, and said, "My father, *if* the prophet had told you *to do* something great, would you not have done *it*? How much more then, when he says to you, 'Wash, and be clean?'" ¹⁴ So he went down and dipped seven times in the Jordan, according to the saying of the man of God; and his flesh was restored like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean. ¹⁵ And he returned to the man of God, and all his aides, and came and stood before him; and he said, "Indeed, now I know that *there is* no God in all the earth, except in Israel; now therefore, please take a gift from your servant." ¹⁶ But he said, "*As* the LORD lives, before whom I stand, I will receive nothing." And he urged him to take *it*, but he refused. ¹⁷ So Naaman said, "Then, if not, please let your servant be given two mule-loads of earth; for your servant will no longer offer either burnt offering or sacrifice to other gods, but to the LORD. ¹⁸ Yet in this thing may the LORD pardon your servant: when my master goes into the temple of Rimmon to worship there, and he leans on my hand, and I bow down in the temple of Rimmon—when I bow down in the temple of Rimmon, may the LORD please pardon your servant in this thing." ¹⁹ Then he said to him, "Go in peace." So he departed from him a short distance. Gehazi's Greed ²⁰ But Gehazi, the servant of Elisha the man of God, said, "Look, my master has spared Naaman this Syrian, while not receiving from his hands what he brought; but *as* the LORD lives, I will run after him and take something from him." ²¹ So Gehazi pursued Naaman. When Naaman saw *him* running after him, he got down from the chariot to meet him, and said, "*Is* all well?" ²² And he said, "All *is* well. My master has sent me, saying, 'Indeed, just now two young men of the sons of the prophets have come to me from the mountains of Ephraim. Please give them a talent of silver and two changes of garments.'" ²³ So Naaman said, "Please, take two talents." And he urged him, and bound two talents of silver in two bags, with two changes of garments, and handed *them* to two of his servants; and they carried *them* on ahead of him. ²⁴ When he came to the citadel, he took *them* from their hand, and stored *them* away in the house; then he let the men go, and they departed. ²⁵ Now he went in and stood before his master. Elisha said to him, "Where *did you go*, Gehazi?" And he said, "Your servant did not go anywhere." ²⁶ Then he said to him, "Did not my heart go *with you* when the man turned back from his chariot to meet you? *Is it* time to receive money and to receive clothing, olive groves and vineyards, sheep and oxen, male and female servants?" ²⁷ Therefore the leprosy of Naaman shall cling to you and your descendants forever." And he went out from his presence leprous, *as white* as snow.
